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The ZCS Bell RESTORED

I have always enjoyed bells. We had one at our house as a kid to call us in from working and playing in the woods. When I attended Taylor University for college, the center of campus was a bell tower announcing the time, chapel, or important events. I even mounted one in my dorm as an unofficial mascot to promote community at meals and other events. Bells are an invitation to join in... but they are louder than I can be with my voice! The bigger, the better!

At the start of the year, we take pictures of the kids by the ZCS sign. Yes, I enjoy having the ZCS sign in the picture, but I really liked the bell! When it was missing at the end of last year, I talked to Bryce Huffman (Director of Facilities at ZCS), who told me how the main bolt had rusted through, causing it to fall off.

The bell had been welded to the mount years ago to keep it from swinging so it wouldn't accidentally hit anyone since it was mounted lower where students could reach it... or ring it late at night as a practical joke to the neighborhood —which apparently happened! The clapper had broken and been bent multiple times prior to that, and it was welded together to keep it functional. The bell itself was filled with sand and capped with concrete to prevent the clapper from being stolen, moved to ring the bell, or broken again.



Mr. Huffman kindly allowed me to take the bell to restore it by forklifting the 400+ lb bell into my minivan. From there, we took the bell and removed the concrete and sand. The bell was professionally sandblasted, and any pitting from rust or the original casting was filled with a commercial-grade filler. A waterproof powder coating paint was applied to keep it weatherproof. The clapper was straightened and repaired, but the broken bolt was not repairable. The clapper is now separate and can be held. An eye bolt was placed to allow a removable clapper to be installed in the future so it could be rung if it was ever reinstalled.

As for the timing of restoring the ZCS Bell aligning with this year's theme, "Restored," my parents taught me that coincidences are more like co-incidences. 

Currently, we need your help by June 30, 2024, to reach this year's goal of \$300,000.





Outdoor Earlier this year, we were thrilled to announce that we will be expanding our outdoor education offerings to include a Young Fives afternoon add-on at the ZCS main campus. We believe that continuing to strengthen our outdoor education offerings will support our students, specifically our youngest learners at our Creation Ridge campus, as they make the move from preschool to elementary. We are excited about this next step forward and what it means for all our students. The ZCS Young Fives Nature-based afternoon add-on starts this fall!

History

In 2017, ZCS began gathering information on the benefits of kids having more time in nature. We found that extended time outdoors led to more creative play, health benefits, higher student engagement, and the opportunity to explore God's creation in an educational setting. With this knowledge, ZCS decided that we wanted all our students to engage in more outdoor learning, worship, and play.

Since this time, we've taken small steps to provide more intentional outdoor time, such as adding tools and objects that allow preschoolers to play more creatively outdoors and increasing recess for our elementary and middle school. We have also taken big steps to support outdoor learning, such as opening Creation Ridge, the ZCS outdoor preschool. Most recently, we've piloted Nature-rich classes in Young Fives and Kindergarten.

While the progression of incorporating more outdoor time for our students has ebbed and flowed, we are pleased with the foundation that has been built and the quality of outdoor education we provide. As with all of our programs at ZCS, it's vital for us to provide a well-balanced educational experience for our students. Therefore, in a sense, we have spent the years since opening Creation Ridge exploring what would work well for our community.





"What a fun adventure it has been - taking the kindergarten and Y5's children outside for nature-rich learning, worship, and play!

I am amazed, yet not surprised, at how much our school theme, Restored, and theme verse, 2 Corinthians 5:17, has come up this year in our learning! Metaphors for life abound in creation!

As we have studied caterpillars turning into butterflies, deer shedding their antlers, tad-poles transforming into frogs, the life cycle of a pumpkin, how God prepares insects, pinecones, and all of creation for each season - He too gives us exactly what we need, and He never changes! He is faithful and good. These nature-rich experiences help connect children more and more to their Creator and give a powerful picture of who He is.

I am looking forward to next year with great anticipation. Over the summer, a new playscape will be created for our students. This new Nature-rich playscape has been a collaborative effort, and I am so grateful for all who have been involved in preparing this sacred space for learning, worship, and play!



I can't wait to spend even more time outside with His children! It brings me great joy to continue to use children's natural curiosity; their sense of wonder and awe to lead to a deeper understanding of God's characteristics - and who He is as our Creator!

I deeply hope that we will find His fingerprints dwelling in all of creation and together we will worship Him by proclaiming, 'Wow, God!'"

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
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
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
